About Us

Inclusion College Hook is a small independent SEMH (Special Education Mental Health) college supporting young people with mental health needs and co-occurring neurodivergence. We prioritise the mental health and wellbeing of the students in our care, by providing a safe, nurturing environment which enables them to thrive and grow.

We have three pathways to education and all our students require an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), with the placement agreed by the relevant Local Authority SEND team.

Each student follows an academic programme shaped by their EHCP, Spencer3D* profile, individual strengths and goals. Personal education plans are reviewed regularly, and students can join the pathway at any stage depending on their needs.

*Spencer3D tools considers the whole child, turning observed behaviours into actionable strategies for supporting young people



Blue Pathway

The Blue Pathway is a full-time structured academic programme. It is designed to support independent students and progression into further education, employment or training.

Students attend five days a week (9.15am to 3.00pm). Our mental health and wellbeing team are on hand throughout to support students through their time with us.

The Pathway includes:

- Functional English and maths qualifications
- Personal Development
- Vocational learning
- Careers education
- Real-world learning
- Enrichment and social development

Progress focuses mental health and wellbeing, on functional literacy and numeracy, building self-esteem, developing practical skills, and removing barriers to learning.

Purple Pathway

The Purple Pathway is a personalised programme providing a high level of personalised support for young people who are currently finding it a challenge to access education or employment due to their mental health and wellbeing.

There is a strong focus on wellbeing, working closely with each student, their family and professionals to support a gradual transition to learning.

The Pathway follows a phased approach:

- Building connection, trust and confidence
- Developing strategies, structure and support
- Increasing access to education or employability

Progress is flexible and based on the individual, with the aim is to help students move towards the Blue Pathway when appropriate.

Yellow Pathway

This is our employability pathway, delivered from Inclusion EB8 in central Basingstoke. A full-time, one year academic programme, designed for young people with an EHCP who would benefit from a personalised, relationship-based and work-focused approach to their education.

Students work towards qualifications:

- ASDAN Employability – Entry Level 3 to Functional Skills Level 2
- ASDAN Personal and Social Development – Entry Level 3 to Functional Skills Level 2
- ICT & additional short courses linked to student interests

Employability & Personal Development:

- Confidence, communication, teamwork & independence
- CVs, interviews, workplace expectations & behaviours
- Financial education, digital skills, wellbeing & preparation for adult life

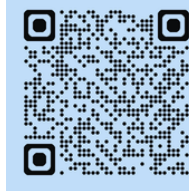


Work Experience, Volunteering & Community Learning:

- Personalised work experience & volunteering placements
- Workplace visits, employer encounters & sector tasters
- Real-world learning linked to each young person's interests, strengths & aspirations

Small groups, personalised support and careers guidance help students progress to employment, further or higher education, apprenticeships, volunteering or adult services.
